LEGISLATORS' COMMENTS

Regarding Resolution 22-293, Mr. Strange requested the data and analysis that was used to determine the need for a Federally Qualified Health Center ("FQHC") in Chemung County.

Mrs. Sonsire stated that she is able to fully support the agreement with The Chautauqua Center, Inc. ("TCC") following a very positive and collaborative conversation with Dr. Terry, D.O., M.B.A., Associate

Dean of Academic Affairs, LECOM, Elmira. Her concerns/questions regarding quality of care and malpractice have been answered and she is excited that the Chemung County Legislature will be responsible for bringing a facility that offers Universal Health Care to the county. She urged her fellow Legislators to continue to support and endorse single payer health care.

Mr. Margeson stated that he agrees with Mrs. Sonsire and has seen firsthand the need for quality health care for all.

Mr. Sweet stated that New York State offers many health care programs, however, eligibility to participate in those programs is determined by a person's ability to pay. The FQHC is a federal program with no income limitations. In talking to his constituents he hasn't received any negative feedback regarding the establishment of an FQHC in Chemung County. He fully supports Resolution 22-293.

Mr. Chalk stated that he met with Senator O'Mara last week to get his perspective on the FQHC. Mr. O'Mara fully supports the FQHC model and has provided the Legislature with a letter stating such support. Mr. Chalk fully supports Resolution 22-293.

Mr. Briggs thanked Mrs. Sonsire for her efforts in gathering information regarding the establishment of an FQHC in Chemung County. He noted that the County Executive has publicly stated that he does not support this effort. He was invited to share his concerns with the Legislature but the invitation was declined.

Mr. Sweet noted that on April 11, 2022 the Legislature passed Resolutions authorizing and directing the County Executive to implement the Orange Zone and Agricultural Subsidy Stimulus Programs as approved in the 2022 County Budget. To date, nothing has been done to get these funds to the businesses and farmers who are in need. Mr. Sweet asked for an update on the status of the application process and the disbursement of funds for these programs.

Mrs. Sonsire noted that the Legislature has (many times) requested information and answers from the County Executive regarding the financial status and patient census numbers for the Chemung County Nursing Facility. To date, no information has been provided. She stated that the Legislature cannot just keep waiting and it is time to dig deeper. She suggested that it is time that the Legislature utilize the powers granted them in the Charter.

Mr. Chalk informed the Legislature that On Wednesday, June 15, 2022 there will be a news conference at Eldridge Park at 1:00 in front of the Vietnam Memorial. Chris Moss and Dan Mandell will have joint announcements proclaiming June 27th through July 4th as Veteran's Week in Chemung County and the City of Elmira. All Legislators are invited to attend.

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Chemung County Legislature has requested authorization to enter into an agreement with Alfred Technology Resources, Inc. d/b/a Incubator Works ("IW") for the provision by IW of promoting entrepreneurship and business start-up and development and growth by identifying, locating and contacting industrial prospects (the "Services") during the period June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023 at a total cost to Chemung County not to exceed \$200,000 (100% Federal share [American Rescue Plan funds]); and

WHEREAS, the City of Elmira has passed a Resolution agreeing to contribute \$200,000 toward the services; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to carry out in a legal and proper manner the provisions of the Federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" ("ARPA") and the County Law of the State of New York, and to provide for the transfer of ARPA money received by the County of Chemung, in consideration of the said Alfred Technology Resources Inc., (D/B/A Incubator Works) (a New York State Not-for-Profit Corporation "Incubator Works") fostering and promoting entrepreneurship and

business start-up and development within the County of Chemung: said Incubator Works to offer to the residents of the Chemung County a place to gather, to work together, and to find support, resources and education on how to start a business, and private non-profit organizations to provide services and programs to respond to

WHEREAS, the County has evaluated and is satisfied that IW presents a low to negligible risk of non-compliance based upon its prior experience, personnel, and ability to oversee and carryout the objectives of the agreement, and will operate and manage the award as a "sub recipient" under 2CFR §200.331(a); and

WHEREAS, monies furnished by the County, hereunder will be transferred for the above in conformity with ARPA 602 (c)(3), and making Incubator Works a "sub recipient" of ARPA funds; and

WHEREAS, Chemung County shall monitor compliance in accordance with 2CFR §200.332(d)-(g) and other applicable regulations and the County's Sub Recipient Monitoring Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Committee has recommended that the Chemung County Legislature approve this agreement; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chemung County Legislature does hereby authorize IW as a "sub recipient" of ARPA funding in the amount of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000) for the period June 1, 2022, through May 31, 2023; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with IW for the Services to the County of Chemung, the terms and conditions of that agreement to be subject to the review and approval of the Attorney for the Legislature, at a total cost not to exceed \$200,000 (100% Federal share [American Rescue Plan funds]) during the period June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023; and, be it further

As you requested, this engagement letter will confirm that Chemung County (the "County") has engaged The Actuarial Advantage, Inc. to provide actuarial services.

As stated in our proposal, our understanding is that the services requested include the following:

- Estimate the County's retained unpaid loss and allocated loss adjustment expenses under the County's self-insured workers compensation insurance program. Estimates will be provided for the County's fiscal years ending December 31 using data valued as of December 31. We will break out the indicated unpaid losses (the outstanding liability) into the Current Liability (the amount expected to be paid in the next 12 months) and longer-term liability. We will allocate the indicated liability to several County departments upon request.
- Provide an actuarial estimate of recommended funding levels for the County's self-insured workers' compensation claims for the coming fiscal year. Funding estimates will be based on our analysis of the County's loss experience. Estimates will be presented at an expected loss level and, upon request by the County, at higher percent confidence levels.

Customer may only return a Product which is not defective if: (a) the Product does not correspond to the Products ordered in the Agreement (a "Return"), or (b) the Product has been ordered in error by the Customer and Genfare has granted written permission to Customer to remedy its mistake by ordering the correct equipment or software and returning the Product (an "Exchange"). The party liable for all shipping, insurance and any other expenses incurred by Customer in returning the Product pursuant to the preceding sentence and for all loss or damage to the Product until received by Genfare, shall be Genfare for Returns and Customer for Exchanges. If Customer returns the Product in accordance with these Procedures in an undamaged condition, in the original configuration and, where appropriate, in the original packing, before the later of: (i) 21 days after the date of the Invoice for that Product; and (ii) the date of substantial completion of installation of the Product by Genfare, Genfare shall: (A) for Returns, issue a credit to Customer for the full Invoice price of the returned Product; or (B) for Exchanges, issue a credit to Customer for the full Invoice. If Customer does not comply with the Procedures in this Section for Returns and Exchanges, Customer shall pay the full amount of the Invoice.

- 7. CUSTOMER POSTPONEMENT OF SCHEDULED SHIPPING DATE. If Genfare receives a request from Customer to delay the Shipping Date (a) 30 days or more prior to the Shipping Date, Genfare may postpone the Shipping Date and may charge Customer 2% of the net Agreement total for each full or partial month the Shipping Date is delayed or (b) less than 30 days prior to the Shipping Date, Genfare may treat the Agreement as canceled and may bill Customer in accordance with the provisions of Section 8.
- 8. CANCELLATION. If Customer cancels an Agreement before the

Shipping Date, Genfare may charge Customer a cancellation charge calculated by multiplying the following applicable percentage by the Agreement total (as shown on the Quotation/Order Acknowledgment): (a) if cancelled 40 business days or more before Shipping Date, the applicable percentage is 50%. In addition to the applicable percentage charge, if Customer cancels all or part of the order without cause, Customer will reimburse Genfare for (i) Genfare's expenses incurred to fulfil the order through the cancellation date, including, without limitation, materials and labor. If Customer's order includes special order Products or vendor Products, Genfare may also charge, in addition to the other amounts set forth in this Section 8, (A) for special order Products, 100% of the amount shown on the Quotation/Order Acknowledgment for that Product; and (B) for vendor Products, the lesser of 100% of the cost to Genfare of vendor Product; or, if the vendor accepts the return of its Product the restocking charge levied by the vendor. Customer shall pay all cancellation charges within 30 days of receipt of Invoice.

- 9. FORCE MAJEURE. To the extent that either party is not able to perform an obligation under this Agreement due to fire, flood, acts of God, severe weather conditions, strikes or labor disputes, war or other violence, acts of terrorism, any law or order of any governmental agency, or other cause beyond that party's reasonable control ("Force Majeure"), that party may be excused from such performance so long as such party provides the other party with prompt written notice describing the condition and takes reasonable steps to avoid or remove such causes of nonperformance and promptly continues performance whenever and to the extent such causes are removed.
- 10. INSTALLATION. If installation is purchased, Customer shall complete all of the action necessary to prepare Customer's premises for the installation of Products prior to the scheduled installation date. If Customer complies with the preceding sentence, Genfare's authorized technicians shall commence the installation of Products on the scheduled installation date. Genfare may invoice Customer for an amount in addition to the installation charge specified on the Quotation/Order Acknowledgment if Genfare incurs additional installation costs as a result of Customer's failure to have the site, other manufacturers' equipment or Products ready for Genfare's technicians on the scheduled installation date.
- 11. WARRANTY. All Products are covered by Genfare's Standard

Warranty as described in Attachment A attached hereto and incorporated herein.

- 12. WAIVER OF CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES; LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, Genfare will not be liable for damages related to any business interruption or loss of profit, increased operating costs, anticipated savings, data, contract, goodwill or the like or for incidental, special, indirect or consequential damages of any nature under any theory of relief, including, without limitation, breach of warranty, breach of contract, tort (including negligence), and strict liability, arising out of or related to Seller's acts or omissions. Under no circumstances shall Genfare's liability to Customer exceed the contract price for the specific goods and services upon which such liability is based. Any action for breach of contract or otherwise must be commenced within one (1) year after the cause of action has accrued.
- 13. INDEMNIFICATION. Genfare agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Customer, its elected and appointed officers and employees, from and against any and all claims, demands, defense costs, liability or damages brought by third parties and to the extent arising solely from: (a) personal injury or property damage resulting directly from Genfare's (or Genfare's subcontractors, if any), negligent acts, errors or omissions or willful misconduct or (b) any actual infringement by Genfare of a patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or other intellectual or proprietary rights regarding the Products (except to the extent resulting from Customer's combination of Genfare's products with other products or services not provided by Genfare). Notwithstanding the foregoing, there shall be no indemnification hereunder by Genfare as to any losses caused by the negligence or fault of Customer or any of its officers, employees or agents. If Customer shall claim indemnification hereunder, Customer shall notify Genfare in writing of the basis for such claim or demand setting forth the nature of the claim or demand in reasonable detail. Genfare agrees to assume the defense of any such claim and to defend the same at Genfare's expense. The parties agree to reasonably cooperate with each other on any such claims. If the Customer desires to participate in the defense, then Customer shall have the right to do so through counsel of its own choosing, provided that Customer will be responsible for all of its costs in so doing.
- 14. INSURANCE. Genfare shall maintain insurance coverage

consistent with its existing programs but shall not name Customer as an additional insured nor will Genfare or its insurers be obligated to waive any rights of subrogation Genfare or such insurers may have against Customer or its affiliates.

Genfare shall use commercially reasonable efforts to provide Customer with written notice of cancellation of any applicable policy thirty (30) days prior to the effective cancellation date of such policy, but failure to do so shall impose no obligation or liability upon Genfare or its insurers, agents or representatives. Genfare shall provide Customer with its standard certificate of insurance upon request.

- 15. NOTICE. All requests, instructions and notices from one party to the other must be in writing and may be given via registered post or facsimile transmission to the address of the parties shown on the Quotation/Order Acknowledgment.
- 16. MISCELLANEOUS. No waiver by Genfare of any breach of this Agreement shall be considered as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision. Any provision of the Agreement which is, or is deemed to be, unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall be severable from the Agreement in that jurisdiction without in any way invalidating the remaining provisions of the Agreement, and that unenforceability shall not make that provision unenforceable in any other jurisdiction. The rights which accrue to Genfare by virtue of the Agreement shall endure for the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of Genfare. The Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois, however Genfare may enforce the provisions of the Agreement in accordance with the laws of the jurisdiction in which the Products are situated. The United Nations Convention on the Sale of Goods (the Vienna Convention) shall not apply to the Agreement.

ATTACHMENT A- WARRANTY

1. DEFINITIONS

- a) Customer shall mean any individual, entity, business, or transit agency that purchases Genfare#s goods, services, and/or software.
- b) Documentation shall mean the manuals, guides, or other applicable materials provided by Genfare to the Customer.
- c) Equipment shall mean new Genfare supplied equipment, firmware embedded on the Genfare supplied equipment, and spare parts.
- d) Equipment Operating Instructions means the instructions for use, maintenance, storage, and repair in the applicable Genfare Equipment Manual.
- e) Equipment Warranty Period shall apply as follows:

i. Equipment:

Begins the earlier of the date of delivery of the Equipment if the equipment is not to be installed, (b) the date of installation by Genfare, or Genfare approved technician if Genfare (or a Genfare approved technician) is completing the installation, and shall end (w) months for Equipment repaired during the Warranty Period or the remaining original warranty period if greater than (6) months

ii. Genfare#s Mid-Life Upgrade and/or Reconditioning Program:</TC>

1. Begins the earlier of the date of delivery of the Equipment if the equipment is not to be installed, (b) the date of installation by Genfare, or Genfare approved technician if Genfare (or a Genfare approved technician) is completing the installation, and shall end (w) six (6) months thereafter; and (z) three (3) months for items repaired during the Warranty Period or the remaining original warranty period if greater than three (3) months.

2071104 1. Begins upon delivery of Spare Parts and shall end six (6) months thereafter.

- f) Genfare Equipment Manual means the manual and/or guides developed by Genfare and made available to a Customer which describe the products, services, and/or software, including proper care and maintenance of such products, services, and/or software.
- g) Genfare Service Center shall mean the Genfare repair facility specified by an authorized Genfare representative.
- h) Hotfix shall mean a single, cumulative package that includes information that is used to address a problem within the Software
- i) Services means technical, training, maintenance, or other services performed by Genfare or an authorized Genfare representative.
- j) Services Warranty Period shall begin upon the completion of the Services and end thirty (30) days thereafter.
- k) Software means all original and software updates purchases of Genfare supplied software.
- 1) Software Warranty shall mean licensed software, but excludes any warranty provided under an applicable subscription and services agreement purchased by Customer.
- m) Software Warranty Period shall begin upon the earlier of (a) the date the Software is made available to the Customer for User Acceptance Testing or (b) date the Software is placed in the production and shall end ninety (90) days thereafter.
- n) Third Party Purchase Warranty Period shall mean the date on which Customer receives the Equipment from Customer#s third party bus manufacturer or other third party vendors and ending twelve (12) months from such date.
- o) Warranty shall mean all applicable warranties purchased by the Customer under this Agreement.
- p) Warranty Period, shall mean the applicable Equipment Warranty Period, Third Party Purchase Warranty Period, the Software Warranty Period, and the Services Warranty Period.

2. GENERAL TERMS

- a) Subject to the provisions of the Equipment Warranty, Genfare warrants that the Equipment shall conform to the specifications in the Genfare documentation in all material respects and that the equipment shall be free from material defects in materials and workmanship.
- b) Genfare warrants that the Services and Software shall materially conform to the specifications in the then-current Documentation.
- c) It is understood that the costs of discovery of the problem associated with any Warranty and, to the extent applicable, the costs associated with the removal and installation of the defective part shall 2071104

3. RETURN OF EQUIPMENT UNDER WARRANTY

- a) If an item of Equipment malfunctions or fails in normal use within the applicable Warranty Period:
- b) Customer shall promptly notify Genfare of the problem, the original sales order number, and the serial number, if applicable, of the defective item;
- i. Genfare shall, at its option, either resolve the problem over the telephone or via email, or provide Customer with a Return Material Authorization (#RMA#) to ship the defective item to Genfare;
- ii. if Genfare provides Customer with an RMA to ship the defective item to Genfare, Customer shall include, in the RMA, a description of the fault. Customer shall, at its cost, properly pack the item to be returned, prepay the insurance and shipping charges, and ship the item to the specified Genfare Service Center with a copy of the RMA; Parts or Equipment damaged during shipment that were not properly packaged are the responsibility of the customer. The return label must include the RMA number with attention to# Repair Center. Genfare reserves the right to return items sent to the Genfare Service Center without an RMA and Customer will reimburse Genfare for its costs in returning the items.
- iii. Genfare shall, at Genfare#s option, either repair or replace the returned item. The replacement item may be new or refurbished; if refurbished, it shall be equivalent in operation to new Equipment. If a returned item is replaced by Genfare, the Customer agrees that the returned item shall become the property of Genfare;
- iv. Genfare shall, at its cost, ship the repaired item or replacement to the Customer. If the Customer has requested express shipping, the Customer shall pay Genfare an expediting fee.
- c) A failure is defined as a device or component in the Equipment that is inoperative and/or unsuitable for the intended purpose.
- d) It is understood that Genfare shall be responsible for the costs of all materials and labor, except as provided herein

4. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.

During the applicable Warranty Period, Genfare shall provide the Customer with Technical Support via phone or email. All communication is to be routed through Customer Care at 847-871-1231, 847.593.8855, or genfare.customercare@spx.com. A case will be created for each inquiry that will be followed through resolution. Technical Support is included throughout the Warranty Period. Customer understands that ongoing Technical Support is the Customer's responsibility and that if a Support Agreement is not secured prior to the expiration of the Warranty Period, Customer is agreeing to support at Genfare#s then-current time and materials rates or as otherwise quoted by Genfare.

5. UPDATES.

During the applicable Software Warranty Period, Genfare shall, at no charge, provide Customer with non-feature software updates to the version of Software installed at the Customer#s location and, if the Equipment is sent to Genfare for

Warranty repair, those revision level updates deemed necessary by Genfare. Non-feature software updates and revision level updates do not generally include additional equipment, such as hardware memory, which enables the upgrades to function in the existing Equipment of Customer. Customer may purchase this additional equipment from Genfare. Updates will be provided based on compatibility and based on Genfare#s reasonable determination that a Software update will resolve an issue the Customer is experiencing. Genfare reserves the right to provide Customer with a Hotfix to resolve an issue between scheduled releases. Any firmware provided by Genfare to Customer is recommended to be tested in a user acceptance testing environment prior to deployment to Customer#s production environment, Genfare#s warranty does not cover issues experienced by Customer where Customer deployed firmware to Customer#s production environment without first testing in the user acceptance testing environment.

6. DEFAULT AND TERMINATION. Genfare may suspend or immediately terminate this Warranty and all of its performance under this Warranty, upon notification to Customer, if Customer: (a) makes any unauthorized modifications to the Equipment or Software; (b) purchases non-OEM supplied parts during the warranty period (c) does not regularly perform preventative maintenance and is unable to show service records or other documentation reasonably requested by Genfare; (d) uses an unauthorized repair facility; (e) assigns or transfers the Customer#s rights or obligations under this Warranty without the prior written consent of Genfare; (f) becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or is put into receivership; or (g) has not paid Genfare all amounts for services, advance replacement parts supplied under this Warranty, or other additional charges within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice from Genfare. If this Warranty is terminated by Genfare, Customer shall remain liable for all amounts due to Genfare. If Genfare suspends the warranty under Section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), or 6(g), Customer will have the opportunity to cure and must do so within ninety (90) days of Genfare providing notice to Customer. If Customer does not cure within the allotted period, the warranty will terminate upon expiration of the cure period. To cure, Customer must remedy the default in the manner required by Genfare in Genfare#s notice of default to Customer. The term of Customer#s Warranty Period will continue to run during any cure period.

In accordance with your request for information relative to the sole source purchase of an extension of the software and support services for the C-Tran Fare Collection System, we provide the following justification.

The fare collection system was purchased on October 3rd, 2017 as a result of a competitive procurement; RFP-1962. The contract included the subscription to license Genfare's proprietary Genfare Link software, e-Fare portal, and accompanying software and support services. The County contracted the software subscription and support services for a four-year term which expires on July 1, 2022. The County can purchase a 3-year extension of the software subscription and support services with additional one-year options.

Genfare is the sole manufacturer and developer of the fare collection system products and software provided by the contract and in use today by C-Tran. As such, only Genfare has the capability to license, maintain and support the products and software.

Many of the fare collection system parts and components are custom made for C-Tran, by Genfare, using special production techniques, tooling and setups. The mechanical and electrical components are made to our exact specifications and tested by Genfare to assure optimum performance and the highest level of reliability. For these reasons, it is important that only genuine Genfare parts and components are used in the fare collection system to assure that the system continues to perform at the required level of reliability and accuracy.

Genfare is the sole developer of the Genfare Link software. The Link software processes fare payments including credit card transactions and provides the county with reports for planning, federal NTD reporting, and finance. The software is designed to be highly available, accurate, and secure. For these reasons, it is essential that only qualified and authorized Genfare personnel have access to the software for maintenance, improvements, and support.



Genfare sells and licenses fare collection equipment, point-of-sale systems, and software to Transit Authorities. Genfare is the sole source supplier of this fare collection system equipment, software and related maintenance and support. Please note that these prices represent "Most Favored Customer Prices" and an extension of a competitively procured and negotiated contract.

All prices quoted are FOB Elk Grove Village, Illinois. Software subscriptions and support services are invoiced at the beginning of each term. Genfare payment terms are Net 30 Days.

AGREEMENT FORM

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into this day of October , 2017 by and
between the County of Chemung, 203 Lake Street, Elmira, New York 14901 (Administrative Office address), hereinafter designated as the OWNER, and:
Genfare, a division of SPX Corporation; 800 Arthur Avenue; Elk Grove Village, Illinois 60007
Hereinafter designated the CONTRACTOR.

WITNESSETH: That the parties hereto, each in consideration of the Agreements of the part of the other herein contained, have mutually agreed and hereby mutually agree, the OWNER for itself and its successors and the CONTRACTOR for itself, himself, herself, or themselves and its successors, his, hers, or their executors, administrators and assigns as follows:

Article 1. DESCRIPTION: Under this Agreement and Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall proceed to supply products and services as hereby described:

Furnish and install a turn-key Automated Fare Collection (AFC) System with 28 units, base fare medium,

website and support options, two ticket vending machines, spare parts, and service plans as further set forth in Attachment 3. Cost not to exceed \$592,780. The mobile ticketing option will be available at indicated pricing until December 31, 2020.

Article 2. In consideration of the payments to be made as hereinafter provided, and of the performance of the Owner of all of the matters and thing to be performed by the Owner and herein provided; the Contractor agrees, at his/her own sole cost and expense, to furnish all materials and provide all services necessary to complete the contract work described under Article 1. Hereof, within the time hereinafter specified and in accordance with the terms, conditions and provisions of this Contract and with the instructions, orders and directions as contained in the proposal document, unit prices proposed and specifications, made in accordance with this Contract.

Article 3. The Owner agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to accept as full compensation for all materials furnished and/or equipment and supplies sold as specified in Attachment 3, and for faithfully completing the work and supplying all materials/products as specified in Attachment 3, the prices stipulated in Attachment 3 hereto attached.

Article 4. Attachment 1 - Supplemental Terms and Conditions

In the event of a conflict between these supplemental terms and conditions (or the subject matter thereof) and any term or condition (or the subject matter thereof) in the underlying RFP, Proposal, Contract, Contract Documents or any other document, these additional terms and conditions shall apply in precedence over such other terms and conditions and the related subject matter, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law.

Acceptance. The goods and services shall be deemed accepted, and any attempt by Owner to reject an order or shipment of goods shall be waived and not enforceable, unless Owner has (i) promptly inspected the goods and services, and written notice from Owner of any defect has been received by Contractor within thirty (30) days following any delivery of goods or performance of services; and (ii) given Contractor reasonable advance notice and authorization to attend any tests designed to demonstrate that goods or services are defective, and the test conditions are mutually agreed to by Owner and Contractor. Goods may not be returned without obtaining written authorization and shipping instructions from an authorized representative of Contractor.

Further, this program provides for families in crisis due to the imminent risk of a child being placed in inpatient hospitalization. Funding will result in the reduction of need and length of costly psychiatric hospitalizations.

The Office for People with Developmental Disabilities state aid award for the Early Childhood Screening Program will remain \$70,639 in 2022. The Early Childhood Screening program provides comprehensive screening services to pre-school children to assess developmental status and sensory functioning. The Early Childhood Screening Program administers approximately 3,500 Development Screening activities.

The Nurse Home Visiting program is requested to remain \$278,842 in 2022. The Nurse Home Visiting Program will be 100% Federally reimbursed through our Flexible Funds for Family Services Plan. On behalf of the Department of Mental Hygiene, please consider this correspondence as our request to renew the Memorandum of Understanding with the Southern Tier Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Team for 2022.

Per the August 23, 2021 state aid award letter, the Southern Tier ACT Team qualifies for \$33,485 in OMH state funding. This is an increase of \$249, as compared to 2021. Of the \$33,485, Chemung County Mental Hygiene will retain a 10% administrative fee of \$3,348. Therefore, \$30,137 is available to the ACT Team in 2022.

The ACT Teams provide mobile intensive treatment and support to people with psychiatric disabilities. The focus is on the improvement of an individual's quality of life in the community and reducing the need for inpatient care, by providing intense community-based treatment services by an interdisciplinary team of mental health professionals. The ACT program has low staff-outpatient ratios in a multi-discipline team approach; 24 hour, seven days per week availability; enrollment of consumers, and flexible service dollars. Treatment is focused on individuals who have been unsuccessful in traditional forms of treatment.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AGREEMENT WITH THE CHAUTAUQUA CENTER ON BEHALF OF THE CHEMUNG COUNTY LEGISLATURE

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Chemung County Legislature has requested authorization to enter into an agreement with The Chautauqua Center ("TCC") for the establishment by TCC of a Federally Qualified Health Center ("FQHC") (the "Services") whereby TCC would receive a fixed amount sub award from Chemung County not to exceed \$1,000,000 (100% Federal share [American Rescue Plan funds]) distribution of the award being contingent upon TCC receiving all required State approval need to operate a facility in Chemung County as an FQHC and contingent upon TCC committing to operate the FQHC in Chemung County for at least five (5) years or the funding shall be returned; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this agreement is to carry out in a legal and proper manner the provisions of the Federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" ("ARPA") and the County Law of the State of New York, and to provide for the transfer of ARPA money received by the County of Chemung, in consideration of the said The Chautauqua Center (a New York State Not-for-Profit Corporation) using the funding to establish an FQHC to be operated in Chemung County, the award to be used for capital procurement and/or renovation; and

WHEREAS, upon establishment, the FQHC will operate as an independent (non-County) medical facility with no part of operations funded by the County, which fills a void in provision of medical services, particularly to the underserved and Medicaid population, because FQHC's receive higher Medicaid reimbursement than hospitals and primary care providers; and

WHEREAS, the County has evaluated and is satisfied that TCC presents a low to negligible risk of non-compliance based upon its prior experience, personnel, and ability to oversee and carryout the objectives of the agreement, and will operate and manage the award as a "sub recipient" under 2CFR §200.331(a); and

WHEREAS, monies furnished by the County, hereunder will be transferred for the above in conformity with ARPA 602 (c)(3), and making TCC a "sub recipient" of ARPA funds; and

WHEREAS, Chemung County shall monitor compliance in accordance with 2CFR§200.332(d)-(g) and other applicable regulations and the County's Sub Recipient Monitoring Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Committee has recommended that the Chemung County Legislature approve this agreement; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chemung County Legislature does hereby authorize TCC as a "sub recipient" of ARPA funding an amount not to exceed ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) for capital procurement and /or renovation for the operation of an FQHC; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with TCC for the Services to the County of Chemung, the terms and conditions of that agreement to be subject to the review and approval of the Attorney for the Legislature, at a total cost not to exceed \$1,000,000 (100% Federal share [American Rescue Plan funds]), contingent upon TCC receiving all required State approval need to operate a facility in Chemung County as an FQHC and contingent upon TCC committing to operate the FQHC in Chemung County for at least five (5) years or the funding shall be returned; and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the agreement with TCC is subject to and conditioned upon the receipt by the County of Chemung of the Federal monies referred to in the Preamble of this Resolution and in the event that the County of Chemung does not receive the Federal monies more particularly described in the Preamble to this Resolution, the agreement with TCC shall be of no further force and effect, and shall terminate without further action by this Legislature; and, be it further

- A) The Chemung County Legislature has adopted a resolution authorizing entry of the said municipality into the Tax Bill Printing/Administration Services for 2021 as outlined and sanctioned by GML 119-o and 119-n.
- B) The signing of this agreement commits the Chemung County Treasurer's Office to participate in this Tax Bill Printing/Administration Services commencing on the first day of July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023.

- G) The County of Chemung agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the BOCES and their agents and employees against any and all claims, losses, demands, and liabilities to which the BOCES may be subjected as a result of a breach of this contract or the negligence of Chemung County or the Chemung County Treasurer's Office.
- H) The BOCES agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the County of Chemung and their agents and employees against any and all claims, losses, demands, and liabilities to which the County of Chemung may be subjected as a result of a breach of this contract or the negligence of BOCES.



Need

The Covid pandemic highlighted the lack of the public health office to compile and prepare data in a timely manner. The ability to track this data and look at the "big picture" of communicable disease spread are vital to developing prevention strategies and something the health department has been unable to do before the Covid pandemic. We learned during the pandemic that the previous model of waiting for data from NYS is not realistic and does not serve our community in a timely manner. The nurses of the public health department are unable to compile and track data and fulfill the other

clinical requirements within their public health programs. I have included graphs and information demonstrating the increase in disease occurrence for sexually transmitted infections (STI's), tick borne diseases, food and water borne disease and lead poisoning. These concerning disease trends illustrate the need to compile and analyze data in a timely manner at the local level to inform planning and prevention efforts.

Data for Current County Disease Tends

Sexually transmitted Infections (STI's)

Syphilis develops in stages and patients may not show symptoms for years. If left untreated syphilis may damage the brain, nerves, eyes, heart, blood vessels, liver, bones and joints. Babies born to women with syphilis are at risk for deafness, teeth deformities and saddle nose — where the bridge of the nose collapses. Untreated syphilis may increase the chance of HIV infection in men and women. In addition, babies born with syphilis can also be born too early, may die in the womb before birth or after birth.

Gonorrhea, if left untreated, can lead to pelvic inflammatory disease, infertility, or ectopic pregnancy in women. Gonorrhea, if left untreated, can lead to infertility or disseminated gonococcal infection in men. Babies born to women with gonorrhea are at risk for blindness, joint infections, or blood infections.


Chlamydia, if left untreated, can lead to blocked fallopian tubes, infertility, long-term abdominal pain, or ectopic pregnancy in women. Chlamydia, if left untreated, can lead to infertility in men. Untreated chlamydia may increase the chance of HIV infection in men and women. Babies born to women with Chlamydia are at risk for eye infections, pneumonia, or pre-term birth.



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
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



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Lead Poisoning

Exposure to lead can seriously harm a child's health, including: damage to the brain and nervous system, slowed growth and development, learning and behavior problems, hearing and speech problems.













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


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What we see is that lead poisoning consistently and disproportionately impacts babies between 9-36 months.



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


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Tickborne Disease

Untreated Lyme disease can cause: chronic joint inflammation (Lyme arthritis), particularly of the knee, neurological symptoms, such as facial palsy and neuropathy, cognitive defects, such as impaired memory, and heart rhythm irregularities.

In rare cases, anaplasmosis and ehrlichiosis can cause serious complications such as: brain problems such as confusion, seizures, or coma, excess bleeding, heart failure, breathing failure, kidney failure, septic shock. These complications are rare in the vast majority of otherwise healthy people. But they are more common in those who have weak immune systems.






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note that anaplasmosis more than tripled from 2020-2021



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
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Foodborne Illness

Most people who become ill with campylobacteriosis get diarrhea (loose stool/poop) which may be bloody, cramping, abdominal pain, and fever within two to five days after exposure to the bacteria. Nausea (a feeling of sickness in the stomach) and vomiting may also occur. The illness typically lasts about one week. In people with weakened immune systems (such as those with cancer, HIV/AIDS, or a transplant), the bacteria may spread to the bloodstream and cause a serious life-threatening infection.

Salmonellosis is typically not life threatening but however complications can be dangerous for those with weakened immune systems, pregnant women, and babies. Those complications include infection of the bloodstream (including the tissue around brain and spinal cord, the linings of the heart, bones and bone marrow, and lining of blood vessels.

Most healthy adults recover from E. coli illness within a week. Some people — particularly young children and older adults — may develop a life-threatening form of kidney failure called hemolytic uremic syndrome.





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


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Waterborne Illness

Occasionally, people with giardiasis will have long-term complications such as reactive arthritis, irritable bowel syndrome, and recurring diarrhea that can last for years. Among children in particular, severe giardiasis may delay physical and mental growth, slow development, and cause malnutrition

Legionellosis can lead to a number of life-threatening complications, including: respiratory failure, septic shock, and acute kidney failure.







- Field Use Charge \$1,757.55 per month per aircraft
- Parcel C \$3,919.98 annually
- Fuel Flowage Fees for all fuel pumped into its aircrafts

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT by and between the COUNTY OF CHEMUNG, a municipal corporation having its principal place of business at 203 Lake Street, Elmira, New York, hereinafter referred to as "County" and CORNING INCORPORATED, a corporation having an office at Elmira/Corning Regional Airport, hereinafter referred to as "Company".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County of Chemung has, by resolution, authorized the County to enter into an agreement under Article 14 of the General Municipal Law to lease its facilities for services at the Elmira/Corning Regional Airport (the "Airport"); and WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on the XX day of XXX, 20XX, pursuant to law, and the execution and delivery of this Agreement has been authorized by Resolution No. XX-XXX of the Chemung County Legislature, which resolution is attached hereto and made, a part hereof as though herein fully set forth, and marked Attachment A, and

WHEREAS, the Company owns land located at 348 Sing Sing Road, Horseheads, New York, adjoining the Airport and set forth on the map attached hereto as Attachment B upon which are situate certain facilities, to wit: a hangar, office space and ramp; and WHEREAS, the facilities of the Company are permanently affixed to the land; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Company desire to enter into an agreement relative to the use by the Company of certain facilities of the County at the Airport.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby mutually agreed between the parties, in consideration of the fees hereinafter stated and the terms, covenants and conditions herein contained, as follows:

- 1. To the extent permitted by law, rule or regulation (including regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA")(collectively, the "Laws"), the County hereby grants to the Company, for a period of four (4) years, a non-exclusive right of way, in common with others authorized to do so by the County in writing, to, from, on and over Airport land adjoining the Airport and set forth on the map attached hereto as Attachment B (the Airport land identified on such map and the Taxi Way being referred to herein as the "Premises"), for access to and from the Airport for the purpose of maintaining, operating, repairing, cleaning, outfitting, caring for, fueling, inspecting, and use of any and all airplanes and related equipment owned or leased by the Company which are based aircraft and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, for all purposes of ingress and egress to and from the Airport (the "Permitted Operations").
- 2. The Company agrees that it shall be fully responsible for the maintenance and care of its own facilities.
- 3. The County shall perform its maintenance obligations regarding the Airport as required by the Laws. Included in this is the obligation of the County to remove all snow from the area depicted on Schedule "A" in red at such times as it does so with the runways and consistent with the operations and maintenance standards of the Airport. However, the

scheduling of the clearing of the snow shall occur after the runway and other priority areas are cleared first.

- 4. Without the prior consent of the County, the Company agrees not to conduct any actions on the Premises other than the Permitted Operations.
- 5. The Company agrees to pay the County an amount for use of the County facilities as follows:
 - a) Field Use Charge shall be \$1.757.55\frac{1.577.90}{1.577.90} per month per aircraft. This amount shall be adjusted annually beginning January 1. 2019 by the Consumer Price Index for the previous twelve (12) months.
 - b) Rental of that portion of the Premises identified on Attachment B hereto as a 7,000 square foot parcel in front of the Company's hangar at a rate of \$3,919.98589.68 annually. This amount shall be adjusted annually beginning January 1, 2019 by the Consumer-Price Index for the previous twelve (12) months.
 - c) The Company agrees to monitor all non-company owned or leased transient aircraft using its facilities and shall send a monthly report to the County and the County shall bill directly to the responsible party for the applicable landing fees.
- 6. The Company also agrees to pay the County a fuel flowage fee for all fuel it pumps into its based owned or leased aircraft from its facilities at the Airport according to the most current Airport schedule of fees.
- 7. The County shall prepare and send to the Company a statement of said charges incurred by the Company. All applicable fees and charges are to be paid no later than the tenth day after receipt of the statement, with a late charge of one and one-half (1 1/2) percent per month on any payment thereafter.
- 8. The term of this Agreement shall be four (4) years and commence December 1, 2022+8 and end November 30, 20262, unless the Company or the County shall give notice of termination by written notice to the Company or the County, as the case may be, at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of each calendar year.
- 9. The Company covenants and agrees to observe and obey all existing Laws in effect or which are currently in force and effect or which may, from time to time, during the terms hereof, be generally promulgated and enforced with respect to the Airport and the Company agrees to comply with the NFPA (or its successor) standards for fuel farms.
- 10. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1 hereof, the County may cancel this Agreement by giving the Company thirty (30) days advance written notice, to be served personally or by registered or certified mail, on any officer, director, or agent of the Company at the Company's present office address at Houghton Park, Corning, New York 14831 or at any subsequent office address, or at the Company's address or facilities at the Airport on or after the happening of any one of the following events:
 - a) The filing by the Company of a voluntary petition of bankruptcy.
 - b) The institution of proceedings in bankruptcy against the Company and the adjudication of the Company as a bankrupt pursuant to such proceedings.
 - The taking by a court of jurisdiction of the Company and its assets pursuant to proceedings brought under the provisions of any Federal bankruptcy act; and

- such proceedings shall remain undismissed for ninety (90) days or the petition commencing such proceedings shall have been judicially approved.
- d) The appointment of a receiver of the assets of the Company and the failure of the Company to have such appointment stayed or vacated within thirty (30) days of said appointment.
- e) The abandonment by the Company of its business at the Airport.
- The default by the Company in the performance of any covenant or agreement herein required to be performed by it and its failure to remedy such default for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt from the County of written notice to remedy the same. No waiver of default by either party of any of the terms, covenants or conditions hereof to be performed, kept and observed by the Company shall be construed to be or act as a waiver by the County of any subsequent default of any of the terms, covenants and conditions herein contained to be performed, kept and observed by the Company.

11. Indemnification/Insurance:

- a) The Company shall indemnify and hold harmless the County from any and all demands, losses, liabilities or judgments, together with costs and expenses incident thereto, which may accrue against, be charged to, or be recoverable from the County as a result of the negligent acts or omissions of the Company, its employees, agents or contracted parties, in connection with the use by the Company of the Airport and the Premises, excluding, however, such acts or omissions as may be occasioned by the negligence of the County, its employees or agents. The County shall give to the Company prompt and timely notice of any claim made or suit instituted which, in any way, directly or indirectly, contingently or otherwise affects or might affect the Company and the Company shall have the right to compromise or participate in the defense of the same to the extent of its own interest. The Company shall give to the County prompt and timely notice of any claim made or suit instituted, which, in any way, directly or indirectly, contingently or otherwise affects or might affect the County.
- b) The Company agrees either to maintain (i) a policy of insurance reasonably acceptable to the County; or (ii) a self-insurance program including, without limitation comprehensive public liability insurance with a single limit of at least Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) in the case of bodily injury to death of one person or more than one person on account of or arising out of any one occurrence and at least Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) in the case of property damage. All such amounts of insurance shall be subject to increase as reasonably required by the County every three (3) years.
- 12. The Company shall not at any time assign this Agreement or sublet its right to use the Premises without the consent in writing of the County.

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- 13. The Company agrees to the provisions of Sections 103A and 103B of the General Municipal Law which require testifying for a grand jury and penalties for the failure to do so.
- 14. The County has granted to Elmira/Corning Air Service, a Fixed Base Operator, the right to sell aircraft fuels, lubricants and propellants at the Airport. Notwithstanding such right, the parties hereto agree that the Company has the right to maintain fuel on its property and to fuel and lubricate its' based owned or leased aircraft so long as it complies with all applicable local, state and federal rules, regulations and standards relating thereto.
 - 15. Company has the right to self-insure.
- 16. The County has applied for and received a grant or grants of money from the Administrator of the FAA pursuant to the Airport and Airways Development Act of 1970, as the same has been amended and supplemented, and under prior federal statutes which said Act superseded and the County may in the future apply for and receive such grants. In connection therewith, the County has undertaken and may in the future undertake certain obligations respecting its operation of the Airport and the activities of its contractors, the Company, and permittees thereon. The performance by the Company of the promises and obligations contained in this Agreement is, therefore, a special consideration and inducement to the execution of this Agreement by the County, and the Company further agrees that if the Administrator of the FAA or any other governmental officer or body having jurisdiction over the enforcement of the obligations of the County in connection with the Federal Airport Aid, shall make any orders, recommendations, or suggestions respecting the performance by the Company of its obligations under this Agreement, the Company will promptly comply therewith at the time or times, when and to the extent that the County may direct.
 - 17. In performing any of the services or activities pursuant to this Agreement:
 - (a) The Company shall comply with the minimum operating standards or requirements in accordance with the Ordinance or future ordinances promulgated by the County, applicable to each of the Company's activities on the Airport, and with such standards or requirements promulgated by any airline or government agency utilizing the Airport.
 - (b) The Company shall furnish services on a fair, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory basis to all users of the Airport requesting the services of the Company. Such services shall be deemed fair, reasonable and nondiscriminatory if furnished consistent with the current Ordinance, and any subsequent amendments thereto or future ordinances promulgated by the County, FAA Grant Assurances and other rules and regulations required to be followed by the Airport. The Company shall furnish service adequate to meet all reasonable demands at the Airport commensurate with the size and capacity of the Improvements. The Company shall charge fair, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory prices for each unit of sale or service; provided, however, that the Company shall be allowed to make reasonable and nondiscriminatory discounts, rebates, or other similar types of price reductions to volume purchaser and air carriers which shall not reduce fees otherwise payable to the Airport. It is understood and agreed that nothing

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contained herein shall be construed to grant or authorize the granting of an exclusive right within the meaning of Section 308(a) of the Federal Aviation Act.

- 18. (a) Should the Company have access at any time to the computer and other information technology systems of the County (collectively, the "Systems") for any reason, #the Company shall ensure that such access does not compromise, adversely affect or permit unauthorized access, either directly or indirectly to, the Systems (a "Breach") in any way and for any reason. If the County, in its sole good faith judgment, determines that such access either is adversely affecting the Computer Systems or has the potential to adversely affect the Computer Systems, then notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, the County shall have the right to suspend and/or terminate immediately such access of the Company. The County shall endeavor to give the Company notice of such suspension and/or termination as expeditiously as possible, consistent with the County's obligations regarding the safeguarding of such information.
 - 19. (b) The Company confirms that, with regard to any Breach, money damages shall not be a sufficient remedy, therefore the County, in addition to suspending or terminating the Company's access thereto, also shall have the right to seek an injunction against any further attempted access by the Company to the Computer Systems.
 - 20. (c) The Company shall not permit any third party from obtaining any access to the Computer Systems without the County's prior, written permission.
 - 24. (d) Should any Breach occur, the Company immediately shall notify the County of such Breach and shall provide the County with any and all information of the Company pertaining to the Breach and the Company's access to the Computer Systems. In such event, the Company shall follow and shall assist the County in the County's flowing, of all notification obligations and other protocols required under any Federal, State or local rules or regulations, all at the Company's sole cost and expense. The Company shall reimburse the County for all costs and expenses incurred by the County in connection with the Breach, including the costs of following all such protocols.
 - 22. (e) Should the County request, the Company, at its own cost and expense, shall prepare and deliver to the County as expeditiously as possible a "SOC-2" audit for itself and for any party that is permitted through the Company to access any of the Computer Systems.
- 23-19. The Company shall at the end of the term of this Agreement, quit and surrender the premises in as good order and condition as when received, natural wear and tear by the elements excluded and excepted.
- 24-20. The Company will not make any use of the Premises which is improper, offensive or contrary to any law, ordinance or which would void any insurance of said premises.
- 25.21. All rights-of-way enjoyed by the Company by virtue of this Agreement over property of the County shall terminate upon termination of this Agreement.

This agenda item respectfully requests approval to submit a Section 268 application for The Elmira Sewer District to the OSC. The purpose of the application is to receive approval from the State Comptroller to increase the cost per average household due to the upcoming Wastewater Treatment Plant Consolidation project. State Comptroller approval is necessary since the cost of the project is over the threshold of \$11 for average estimated increased cost to the typical property for sewer improvements. In order to obtain financing for the project and to issue debt OSC approval is necessary. The expected cost for these improvements in ESD is \$133,950,000. All work has been designed by a currently licensed New York State Professional Engineer.

- (c) The maximum cost of the proposed improvements is \$235,000,000 of which \$133,207,688 is the District's share, all as further broken out in the map, plan and estimate of cost.
- (d) In considering its determination that the proposed improvements are in the public interest, the County Legislature considered the content of the map, plan and estimate of cost to conclude that the proposed improvements are necessary and all property upon which the user charges are to be imposed will be benefited by the improvements and no benefited property has been excluded.
- The proposed method of financing the cost of the improvements shall be through a (e) combination of grants and low-interest loans. The Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund (CWSRF), administered by the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), provides 20-30 year term low-interest or interest-free loans for wastewater infrastructure financing. Interest-free (hardship) financing is awarded based on project score and Median Household Income (MHI). Projects are scored based on factors such as consolidation of infrastructure, regulatory compliance, environmental health, aesthetics, service of environmental justice areas, and financial need. Based on the nature and scope of the proposed project, it is likely that the County will qualify for up to \$20 million of interest-free hardship financing from EFC. In addition, the County has been awarded a Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) grant of \$10 million and a Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grant of \$25 million. It is estimated that the project balance in excess of grant funding and hardship financing will be financed with a lowinterest loan from the EFC. For the purpose of this funding scenario, an annual interest rate of 2 percent and a loan term of 30 years was assumed for any borrowing beyond grant and hardship awards. For purposes of project bond resolutions, the most conservative scenario in which no grants or hardship funding were awarded was assumed. Three funding scenarios are presented in the attached Project Debt Summary Table prepared as part of the detailed design of the Project. Introduction

The County of Chemung has developed this fiscal and subrecipient monitoring plan as required pursuant to the requirements of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act, and the American Rescue Plan (ARP). Chemung County staff, along with the grant program managers and recipients, are responsible for fiscal monitoring of expenditures of federal grants awarded to subrecipients, including local government units, public development corporations, and nonprofit organizations.

Overview

Chemung County serves as a pass-through entity for federal awards and, as such, is required to monitor the activities of subrecipients as needed, ensuring subawards are used for the authorized purposes, in accordance with federal statutes, regulations, and terms and conditions of the subaward. Monitoring includes an assessment of documentation and data maintained by the subrecipient; information obtained in interviews; and information obtained through observation. Should there be any changes to programs or policies relevant to a particular award, Chemung County may use interviews, email, and hard-copy paper communication to do this.

Subrecipient monitoring activities/methods that Chemung County can use include, but are not limited to, the following: annual risk assessment, single audit review, limited-scope audits, site visits, subrecipient report review, prior approval for certain activities, third-party evaluations, and technical assistance and training.

Purpose and Authority

Chemung County adheres to the following federal regulatory provisions under which fiscal accountability and compliance monitoring are conducted:

- 2 CFR §200.331 Requirements for Pass-Through Entities;
- 2 CFR §200.3474 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements;
- 2 CFR §200 EDGAR Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards;
- 34 CFR §74 Administration of Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and other Non-Profit Organizations;
- 34 CFR §80 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements; and
- OMB Circular A-133 Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations.

Internal Controls

Chemung County is responsible for ensuring its compliance with state and federal regulations in all aspects of grants' fiscal and programmatic management.

County Responsibilities/Activities

All subrecipient grant requests for subawards are reviewed and approved by the Legislature. Subawards undergo a review process prior to submission to the Legislature, to ensure that the proposed subrecipient has the financial resources, programatic experience, and proper staffing, plans, policies and status to provide the County reasonable assurance that the subaward will be administered efficiently and properly pursuant to Federal and program requirements.

The County reviews subrecipient activities to provide reasonable assurance that the subrecipient administers federal awards in compliance with federal requirements by review of programmatic reports and on-site monitoring visits. Other activities that County fiscal and program staff carry out include:

- conducting fiscal monitoring;
- processing fund requests in a timely manner;
- correspondence to track grant programs and progress;
- developing policies for grant monitoring, single audits, and fund request/reimbursement process;
- regularly communicating the most recent up-to-date guidance on processes;
- ensuring sufficient guidance on the use of the grant funds; and
- conducting workshops, webinars, and meetings when needed.

Risk Assessment

The risk assessment identifies the likelihood a subrecipient may fail to observe prescribed rules. The risk assessment of an organization does not indicate the organization has passed or failed, but merely establishes whether the organization's compliance risk level is acceptable to the County. An organization's compliance and noncompliance can only be determined by an independent auditor or after a review by County monitoring staff.

Chemung County will conduct an annual risk assessment by reviewing all audit reports submitted by subrecipient organizations and, as a result, risk levels can change from year to year. The risk assessment targets areas that help identify changes critical to assessing the subrecipient's risk level, such as: financial problems that could lead to diversion of program funds; loss of essential personnel; loss of accreditation to operate the program; rapid growth; new activities or services; organizational restructuring; and complaints regarding program and/or fiscal operations.

This annual review allows Chemung County to focus its resources on the following approaches to mitigate the potential for risk while providing support to subrecipients at the same time:

- Communication Regular communication with all subrecipients regarding programmatic and fiscal updates. Specific, tailored communication with subrecipients in areas identified as a potential risk.
- Technical Assistance Organizations with a medium or high-risk level may be subject to special grant conditions and will be afforded focused technical training and assistance by County staff.
- Selected Subrecipient Monitoring Annually, Chemung County may elect to choose subrecipients for fiscal monitoring. The higher the risk level, the more likely a subrecipient is to be selected for monitoring.

Monitoring

As a federal pass-through entity, Chemung County has responsibility to monitor subrecipients to ensure subawards are used for authorized purposes, and in accordance with federal and state statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions set forth in the subaward. The monitoring process may review time and effort, grant expenditures, payroll cost, non-payroll cost, asset management, grants management.

Fiscal Monitoring Process

Based on annual single audit review and risk assessment, Chemung County develops and conducts the annual subrecipient monitoring plan. The risk assessment tool is used to help in determining the priority of subrecipients to be reviewed and the level of monitoring to be performed. Also, the risk assessment is used in determining the frequency of the subrecipient monitoring. The goal of any subrecipient monitoring is to ensure compliance with applicable federal statutes and regulations and grant program directives and requirements. Subrecipient monitoring is conducted either remotely or on site at the subrecipient locale.

Monitoring activities, at a minimum, encompass a review to determine:

- if costs are allowable, allocable, reasonable, and necessary for the performance and the administration of the program;
- if costs are applied consistently and conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP);
- if costs are supported by adequate documentation, such as vendor invoices, time and attendance records, purchase orders, etc;
- if reported charges represent actual costs, not budgeted or projected amounts;
- if matching requirement contributions were met;
- if matching requirement contributions were from allowable sources;
- if cash advances/drawdowns are only for amounts necessary to meet immediate cash needs:

- if excess cash for the immediate needs of the program does not accumulate beyond the immediate needs of the program; and
- if program funds were used to acquire equipment.

Chemung County requires subrecipients to, at a minimum quarterly, report actual expenditures of funds received from Chemung County.

Corrective Actions Related to Federal Grants

Corrective actions can be imposed by Chemung County when subrecipients of federal grants are found to be noncompliant with the terms and conditions of federal grant programs. The purpose of any such corrective action is to ensure the subrecipient makes the necessary corrections and becomes compliant.

Corrective Action

When a subrecipient does not follow the terms and conditions of federal grant programs, Chemung County can impose corrective action. The purpose of any corrective action is not to punish the subrecipient but to bring them in line with federal requirements.

Noncompliance may be identified in: single audit or single audit review, federal monitoring review, or concerns identified through other means.

Once noncompliance has been identified, the subrecipient will receive notification of the necessary items to address the noncompliance. The notification will outline area(s) of noncompliance, enforcement actions (if any), corrective action plan submittal timeframe, corrective action completion timeframe.

It is the responsibility of the subrecipient to submit a corrective action plan that addresses each monitoring finding and for submitting proper supporting documentation.

Enforcing Corrective Action

Chemung County may impose an enforcement action as part of a corrective action plan or for noncompliance with an earlier corrective action. In 2 CFR §200.338 – Remedies for Noncompliance, Chemung County is authorized to impose enforcement actions. Chemung County may:

- temporarily withhold cash payments pending corrective action;
- disallow all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance; wholly or partly suspend or terminate the federal award;
- initiate suspension or debarment proceedings;
- withhold further federal awards for the grant;
- take other remedies that may be legally available; and
- deny a grant application for federal funding as an enforcement action.

Completing Corrective Action

The subrecipient must validate that it has corrected the activity/deficiency that resulted in the noncompliance. Specific documentation is required, demonstrating the completion of the corrective action by the date identified in the corrective action notification. Required documentation should be sent to the Chemung County email address identified in the corrective action notification along with any questions or concerns. If the subrecipient needs more time to provide such information, they must request an extension in writing.
