A. General Conditions

- 1. Intent: It is Chemung County's intent to award this contract to the proposer submitting the proposal that provides the Best Value to the County. The County has the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive technicalities if its best interest will be served thereby.
- Submission of Proposal: Proposals (Pricing Requested) are to be submitted to the County
 Department and person listed on or before the due date and time. Initial all pages of this
 document and return with the proposal. No vendor contracts shall be signed or agreed to by
 the County.
 - a. Proposals shall remain firm for forty-five (45) calendar days from the proposal due date.
- 3. Insurance: The successful proposer shall provide insurance certificates, and/or other proofs of insurance to Chemung County within one week of notification of award and prior to start of work as follows:
 - a. General Liability Insurance: in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and certificate naming the County of Chemung, its officers, and employees as additional insured on a primary basis.
 - b. Workers Compensation: Proof of workers compensation must be provided.
 - c. Professional Liability Insurance: The Engineer shall procure professional liability insurance for services to be performed pursuant to this contract against the malpractice of errors and omissions of Engineer in the amount of \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollars). Engineer shall provide County of Chemung with a certificate of insurance from an insurance carrier authorized to do business in New York State evidencing that an insurance policy of the aforesaid type is in force. Said certificate shall contain a ten (10) day cancellation, assignment or change of afore described insurance policy, Engineer shall also notify County of Chemung of said cancellation, amendment, or change.
- 4. Prevailing Wage Requirements (IF APPLICABLE): Contractor must pay workers according to NYS prevailing wage schedules applicable on the effective date of the contract. Pursuant to Sections 220 (3-a) of the NYS Labor Law, the successful proposer to whom the County awards the contract, and any subcontractor performing work under said contract, shall submit to Chemung County a transcript of its original payroll records within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the contract (purchase order), and payroll records within thirty (30) days thereafter.
- Issuance of Purchase Order Notice to Proceed: Upon receipt of all required insurance certificates, a purchase order will be issued to the successful contractor, and this shall be the notice to proceed.
- 6. Payment: Payment shall be made within forty-five (45) days of County acceptance of all contract work or receipt of the contractor's invoice, whichever is later.
- 7. Executory Clause: This contract shall be deemed executory only to the extent of the monies appropriated and available for the purpose of the contract, and no liability on account therefore shall be incurred beyond the amount of such monies. It is understood that neither this contract nor any representation by any public employee or officer creates any legal or moral obligation to request, appropriate, or make available monies for the purpose of the contract.
- 8. Financial and Professional Qualifications: The County reserves the right to require the apparent low proposer to furnish evidence, including documentary evidence where deemed necessary, to establish proof of financial responsibility and ability to perform the contract, if awarded. The County reserves the right to conduct investigations as to the qualifications and financial position of the apparent low proposer to the fullest extent allowed by law. The County, in its sole

- discretion, shall determine the financial and professional adequacy of the proposer.
- 9. Vendor Knowledge of Requirements: All prospective proposers must carefully inspect these proposal documents and the actual work site. The submission of a proposal will be construed as evidence that the proposer has made such examinations. Technical questions and/or appointments to tour the work site can be made by contacting the County employee listed on this document.
- 10. Ownership of Documents: All reports, maps, plans, specifications, and other documents prepared by the Engineers, being instruments of service, shall be considered to be property of the County when paid for, pursuant to the Agreement.
- 11. **Delegation of Duties:** The Engineer shall not assign, transfer, or otherwise dispose of this Contract without the previous consent in writing of the County.
- 12. Termination: The Agreement may be terminated by either party with thirty (30) days written notice. The Engineer shall be paid the accumulated fees to the date of the termination of service.
- 13. Term: The Term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning on the 31st day of March202 and terminating on the 1st day of April 2025, and may be extended for 1-year upon written agreement by both parties.
- 14. Compensation The charges for engineering services as outlined in Part II of this Agreement shall not exceed the sum listed in the purchase order without prior written authorization. Projects will be assigned as needed by the Department of Public Works.

Item 2.1.1 Field Survey

Field Crew hourly rate includes additional costs considering required Prevailing Wages.

Item 2.1.5 Borings needed for Design

- <u>Asphalt/Concrete Cores (each)</u>: The costs associated with obtaining asphalt/concrete cores are for performing the work by LaBella Environmental, LLC and are based on the following assumptions:
 - All asphalt/concrete testing of the cores requested by the County will be performed by a third-party testing agency retained by LaBella. All third-party asphalt/concrete testing will be charged to the assignment as a direct expense.
 - Each assignment is assumed to consist of obtaining two (2) asphalt/concrete cores (min.) for each assignment, and the work will take one (1) day to complete at the site.
 - Asphalt cores (borings) are assumed to be a maximum of two (2) ft. below top of payement to determine payement section composition.
 - Work Zone Traffic Control (WZTC), if required, will be provided by the County.
 - Assume a NYSDOT Highway Permit will not be required.
 - Assume a minimum of two (2) cores will be acquired in a single day. Minimum charge will be reflected as two cores.
 - Mobilization for asphalt/concrete cores is included in the costs for asphalt/concrete cores.
- Soil Borings (each): The costs associated with obtaining soil borings are for performing the work by LaBella Environmental, LLC and are based on the following assumptions:
 - Soil boring cost is based on assuming a 50 ft. (min.) boring unless otherwise directed by the County. The assumed soil sampling program will be the following:

Boring Depth (ft.)	Sampling Regimen
0 - 10 ft.	Standard split-spoon
	sampling at 5 ft. intervals.
10 ft 20 ft.:	Continuous split-spoon

20 ft end	Standard sampling at 5 ft.

- An additional charge of \$38/ft. beyond 50 ft. depth of boring will be charged. This
 additional rate is to account for the added effort and tooling necessary for deep soil
 borings.
- A representative of LaBella will be on-site to oversee the soil boring operations, perform soil sample classification, and prepare soil boring logs.
- All testing of the soils requested by the County will be performed by a third-party testing agency retained by LaBella after consulting with the County. All third-party soils testing will be charged to the assignment as a direct expense.
- Rock Cores (each): The costs associated with obtaining rock cores are for performing the work by LaBella Environmental, LLC and are based on the following assumptions:
 - Rock core cost is based on assuming a 10 ft. rock core will be obtained, unless
 directed otherwise.
 - All rock core testing of the cores requested by the County will be performed by a third-party testing agency retained by LaBella. All third-party rock core testing will be charged to the assignment as a direct expense.
- Mobilization (cost per assignment): The costs associated with mobilization are based on LaBella Environmental, LLC performing the work and on the following assumptions:
 - Each assignment is assumed to consist of obtaining two (2) soll borings (min.) and the work will take two (2) days to complete the borings at the site.
 - Per Diem costs for Chemung County for drill rig crew are included.
 - Prevailing wages are applicable for the drilling crew.
 - LaBella will engage and coordinate with Dig Safely NY to determine the potential
 for conflicts of proposed soil boring locations with underground utilities (utilities
 within the ROW). Should additional underground utility investigations be required
 necessitating the use of Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), LaBella will retain an
 Underground Utility Locating Contractor, which will be charged to the assignment as a
 direct expense.
 - Costs associated with coordination and soil boring layout is included.
 - The deliverable to the County will be final soil boring logs with classified soil descriptions.
 - Work Zone Traffic Control (WZTC), if required, will be provided by the County.
 - Assume a NYSDOT Highway Permit will not be required.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 7th day of March, 2024, by and between CHA, with its principal place of business at 3 Winners Circle, Albany, New York 12205 (hereinafter "CHA") and Chemung County, with an office located at 803 Chemung Street, Horseheads, NY 14845 (hereinafter "Client").

Client and CHA, for the consideration hereinafter set forth, hereby agree as follows:

1. Services of CHA

- (a) CHA agrees to provide the professional services described in Exhibit A (hereinafter the "Services") attached hereto and incorporated herein with respect to Replacement of Clark Road bridge over Wyncoop Creek (hereinafter the "Project").
- (b) Any activities or Services not included within the scope of the Services will be considered "Extra Services" and will require additional compensation.
- (c) CHA is responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and coordination of all designs, drawings, specifications, reports, and other services furnished by CHA under this Agreement. CHA shall, without additional compensation, correct or revise any errors, omissions or other deficiencies in its design, drawings, specifications, reports and other services, unless such corrective action is directly attributable to deficiencies in Client-furnished information. In the case of an omission, CHA shall be responsible only for the additional cost, if any, compared with what the cost of work would have been if it were included in the initial estimates of cost.

2. Schedule of Services

CHA shall use reasonable diligence and expediency consistent with sound professional practices to complete the Services in a timely fashion so as to meet Client's requirements. If Client requests significant modifications or changes in the scope or requests Extra Services, the time for performance shall be correspondingly adjusted. If the parties have agreed to a specific Project schedule and specific milestone dates, such information shall be set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto.

3. Responsibilities of Client

- (a) Client shall furnish or make available to CHA any and all of its records, maps, or other data which are pertinent to CHA's work. CHA shall be entitled to use and rely upon, without reverification, the accuracy, reliability and completeness of said records, maps and all other data provided by Client or its employees, agents, officers, or consultants in conjunction with CHA's performance of the Services. Client shall authorize and assist CHA in obtaining any such pertinent information from other public and private sources. When requested by CHA, the Client shall furnish all reasonable assistance necessary for CHA to perform appropriate site investigations.
- (b) Client shall provide all criteria and full information as to the Client's requirements for the Project; designate a person to act with authority on the Client's behalf in respect to all aspects of the Project; examine and respond promptly to CHA's submittals; and give prompt written notice to CHA whenever the Client observes or otherwise becomes aware of any defect in the work.
- (c) Client shall notify CHA promptly of all known or suspected Hazardous Material at the site, of any contamination of the site by Hazardous Materials, and of any other conditions requiring special care, and provide CHA with any available documents describing the nature, location and extent of such materials, contamination or conditions.

4. Compensation

(a) As compensation for the performance of the Services, Client shall pay CHA its fees and expenses in accordance with Exhibit C.

- (b) Client shall reimburse CHA for any application and/or permit fees paid for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.
- (c) Invoices will be rendered monthly for Services performed and expenses incurred during the previous month. Supporting documentation and additional detail will be provided upon Client's request. Payments are due at the address appearing on the invoice within 30 days following the invoice date. Invoices not paid within 30 days will accrue interest from the 31st day at the rate of 1% per month (12% per annum). Any late payment will be applied first to interest and then to the oldest outstanding balance due. If Client contests an invoice, Client may withhold only the contested portion and must timely pay the undisputed portion.
- (d) In the event that Client disputes any portion of an invoice submitted by CHA, Client shall notify CHA within fourteen (14) days of the invoice date, identify the cause of the disagreement, and timely pay any amounts not in dispute. The parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve the dispute within thirty (30) days of Client's notice to CHA. Client's failure to dispute an invoice within fourteen (14) days of the invoice date shall be deemed a waiver of all claims pertaining to that invoice.

5. <u>Termination</u>

- (a) This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon not less than seven (7) days written notice should the other party substantially fail to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement through no fault of the party initiating the termination. Client's failure to make payments when due for Services and expenses shall be deemed a material failure permitting CHA to terminate this Agreement.
- (b) In the event of termination of this Agreement not caused by the fault of CHA, CHA shall be compensated for Services performed and expenses incurred prior to the date of termination along with all reasonable and necessary expenses attributable to such termination.
- (c) Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement shall not terminate for cause if the party in default begins to correct its substantial failure to perform within seven (7) days of receipt of written notice of said substantial failure. Following commencement of the cure, the party in default shall diligently continue to cure within thirty (30) days of the receipt of written notice.

6. Suspension

If CHA fails to receive payment when due for Services and expenses, CHA may, upon seven (7) days written notice to Client, suspend performance of the services without further notice. Upon a suspension of Services, CHA shall have no liability to the Client for delay or damage caused by such suspension.

7. Estimates of Costs and Schedules

CHA's estimate of construction costs and schedules are for budget and planning assistance purposes only. Cost and schedule estimates are based on CHA's professional judgment of the requirements known at the time of the Agreement. Accordingly, CHA does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual costs will not vary from opinions, evaluation or studies submitted by CHA to Client.

8. Relationship of Parties

CHA is, and shall at all times during the term of this Agreement be, an independent contractor of Client. This Agreement and the relationship of the parties shall not be deemed to create or be one of employment, agency, partnership, joint venture or any other association.

9. Use of Documents

All documents produced by CHA pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service and shall remain CHA's property. Submission or distribution of any said instruments of service to meet statutory or regulatory requirements or for other purposes in connection with the Project shall not constitute publication or otherwise affect CHA's reserved rights with respect to said documents. Provided that the Client meets its obligations under this Agreement including, but not limited to, payment, CHA shall grant to the Client AMP_ITEMNUMB

nonexclusive license to use said instruments of service, and shall provide the Client with reproducible copies of Schematic Design, Design Development and final Bidding Drawings, and copies of reports, cost estimates, specifications, and other final documents that Client may request. Documents or computerized materials provided to Client are for Client's use only, for the purposes disclosed to CHA, and Client shall not transfer them to others or use them or permit them to be used for an extension of Services or any other project or purpose for which they were not prepared, without CHA's express written consent. If this Agreement shall be terminated prior to completion of CHA's Services, the Client shall pay a licensing fee to CHA for the Client's continued use of CHA's drawings, plans or other documents for purposes of the Project. Client and CHA agree to indemnify and defend one another for any unauthorized use of any document or computerized materials.

10. <u>Designated Representative</u>

Both parties shall designate specific individuals to act as their respective representatives for this Project. Such individuals shall have authority to transmit instructions, receive information and render decisions relative to the Project on behalf of each respective party.

11. Standard of Care

The standard of care for all professional engineering and related Services performed or furnished by CHA under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by the members of CHA's profession practicing under similar conditions at the same time and in the same locality. There are no expressed or implied warranties, including the implied warranties or merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose, not specified herein.

12. Jobsite Safety

Neither the professional activities of CHA, nor the presence of CHA or their employees and/or sub-consultants at the construction site, shall relieve Client and any other entity of their obligations, duties and responsibilities including, but not limited to, construction means, methods, sequence, techniques or procedures necessary for performing, superintending or coordinating all portions of the Work or construction in accordance with the Contract Documents and any health or safety precautions required by any regulatory agencies. CHA and their personnel have no authority to exercise any control over any construction contractor or entity or their employees in connection with their work or any health or safety precautions. The Client agrees that the contractor(s) is solely responsible for jobsite safety and warrants that this intent shall be made evident in the Client's Agreement with the contractor(s). The Client also agrees that CHA and CHA's consultants shall be indemnified by the contractors and shall be named as additional insureds under the contractor's general liability insurance policy.

13. <u>Test Results</u>

Test results apply only to materials actually tested and represent the condition of the tested material only at the time of testing. There are no expressed or implied warranties made or intended by CHA as to the applicability of test results for other than our purposes for preparation of the study or for any time beyond the actual field and laboratory testing. Unless otherwise stated in writing, the Client assumes responsibility for determining whether the quantity and the nature of the services ordered is adequate and sufficient for the Client's intended purposes.

14. Insurance

(a) CHA shall procure and maintain: (a) worker's compensation and employer's liability insurance in accordance with requirements of the state in which the Services are being performed; (b) commercial general liability insurance (including contractual and contractor's protective liability coverage) with combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage; (c) automobile liability coverage including owned and hired vehicles with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage; and (d) professional liability insurance in the amount of \$2,000,000 per claim.

(b) Upon reasonable notice, Client shall provide CHA with copies of the certificates of insurance necessary to demonstrate that all contractors, subcontractors, independent contractors and others on the site have appropriate insurance coverage, including but not limited to commercial general liability, worker's compensation, disability and, where applicable, professional liability coverage.

15. <u>Indemnification</u>

- (a) CHA shall indemnify and hold harmless Client, its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, agents and employees from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees) that Client is legally obligated to pay as a result of a third party claim concerning the death or bodily injury to any person or the destruction or damage to any property, but only to the extent caused by the negligent act, error or omission of CHA subject to any limitations of liability contained in this Agreement. In no event shall the indemnification obligation extend beyond the date when the institution of legal or equitable proceedings for professional negligence would be barred by any applicable statute of repose or statute of limitations.
- (b) Client shall indemnify and hold harmless CHA, its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, agents and employees from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees) that CHA is legally obligated to pay as a result of a third party claim concerning the death or bodily injury to any person or the destruction or damage to any property, but only to the extent caused by the negligent act, error or omission of Client.

16. <u>Limitation on Liability</u>

The total liability of CHA and its partners, officers, directors, shareholders, employees and agents to Client and any one claiming by, through or under Client for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses or damages whatsoever arising out of, or in any way related to, the Services of this Agreement from any cause or causes whatsoever including, but not limited to, negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability or breach of contract shall not exceed the total compensation received by CHA under this Agreement or the total amount of \$1,000,000, whichever is greater.

17. Assignment of Rights

This Agreement is binding on the heirs, successors, and assigns of the parties hereto. This Agreement may not be assigned by Client or CHA without the prior written consent of the other.

18. Use of Subconsultants

CHA may use independent professional associates, consultants or subcontractors in the performance of a portion of the Services.

19. Third Party Beneficiary

The Services to be performed by CHA are intended solely for the benefit of Client and no benefit is conferred on, nor any contractual relationship established with any person or entity not a party to this Agreement. No such person or entity shall be entitled to rely on CHA's performance of its Services hereunder. No right to assert a claim against CHA, its officers, employees, agents or consultants shall accrue to any third party as a result of this Agreement or the performance or non-performance of CHA's Services hereunder.

20. Waiver of Consequential Damages

In no event shall CHA be liable to Client or the Client to CHA for consequential or indirect damages, including but not limited to, loss of profits or revenue, loss of use of equipment, loss of production, additional expenses incurred in the use of the equipment and facilities and claims of customers of the Client. This disclaimer shall apply to consequential damages based upon any cause of action whatsoever asserted including ones arising out of any breach of contract, warranty, guarantee, products liability, negligence, tort, strict liability, or any other cause pertaining to the performance or non-performance of the contract by Client/CHA.

21. Mediation

The parties, as a condition precedent to commencing litigation (other than for the non-payment of CHA's fees), shall endeavor to resolve their claims by mediation which shall be in accordance with the Construction Industry Mediation Rules of the American Arbitration Association currently in effect. Request for mediation shall be filed in writing with the other party to the contract and with the American Arbitration Association.

22. Electronic Media

Data, words, graphical representations and drawings that are stored on electronic media such as computer disks and magnetic tape, or which are transmitted electronically, may be subject to uncontrollable alteration. Client agrees it may only justifiably rely upon the final hardcopy materials bearing the consultant's original signature and seal.

23. No Waiver

No waiver by CHA or Client of any power, right or remedy hereunder or under applicable law with respect to any event or occurrence shall prevent the subsequent exercise of such power, right or remedy with respect to any other or subsequent occurrence.

24. Severability and Reformation

Any provision or part thereof of this Agreement held to be void or unenforceable under any law shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon the parties. The parties agree that this Agreement shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision which comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

25. Integration & Amendments

This Agreement represents the entire understanding of the parties as to those matters contained herein. No prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect with respect to those matters. This Agreement shall not be amended, modified, supplemented or rescinded in any manner except by written agreement executed by the parties.

26. Force Majeure

CHA shall not be liable for any failure to perform or delay in the performance of the Services due to circumstances beyond its control, including, but not limited to: (1) strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns or stoppages; (2) Acts of God; or (3) failure of Client to furnish information in a timely manner.

27. Choice of Law/Jurisdiction

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of the state where the project is located.

28. No Personal Liability

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, CHA's officers, directors, shareholders, partners, employees, or agents shall not be personally liable, regardless of the cause of action asserted including breach of contract, warranty, guarantee, products liability, negligence, tort, strict liability, or any other cause pertaining to CHA's performance or non-performance of the Agreement. Client will look solely to CHA for its remedy for any claim arising out of or related to this Agreement.

29. Notices

Any and all notices provided for under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given if personally delivered or if mailed, postage prepaid, by certified or return receipt

requested mail addressed to the parties at the addresses set forth above in the preamble. Notice given by certified mail shall be deemed complete on the third business day after mailing.

30. Representations

Each party represents and warrants to the other that:

- (a) It is duly organized and validly existing in the jurisdiction of its organization and has all the necessary power and authority to execute, deliver and perform this Agreement.
- (b) The execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement has received all necessary partnership, corporate or other approvals, and does not conflict with any law, regulation, order, contract or instrument to which such party is bound.
- (c) The individual signing on its behalf is duly authorized to execute this Agreement to legally bind such party.

SCOPE OF SERVICES AND ASSUMPTIONS

Replacement of Clark Road bridge over Wyncoop Creek

SCOPE OF WORK

Project Description and Location

Replacement of Clark Road bridge over Wyncoop Creek

Project Description: Replace the bridge with a durable structure having a 75+ year service life that provides two traffic lanes and shoulders.

Project Location: Clark Road, Town of Chemung, Chemung County.

The anticipated start date of preliminary design is April 2024.

The anticipated Letting Date is December 2024.

The construction completion date will be November/December 2025.

Sponsor is Chemung County. Consultant is CHA Companies.

- 1. Project Familiarization and Data Collection
 - a) Project Familiarization

The County will provide the **Consultant** with the approved project initiation document and with attachments to provide information on:

- Project type
- Project location
- Initial project cost estimate
- Initial project schedule
- Project funding source(s)
- Transportation needs.
- Safety
- Pavement history.
- Anticipated permits and approvals (initial determination).
- County Contact person

The **Consultant** will become familiar with the project before starting any work. This includes a thorough review of all supplied project information and a site visit to become familiar with field conditions.

b) Survey & Mapping – by Chemung County

The **Sponsor** will provide terrain data required for design by means of a topographic field survey. The survey will be done in accordance with the standards set forth in the NYSDOT Land Surveying Standards and Procedures Manual and in accordance with local standards described in Section 10 of the SOS.

The **Sponsor** shall establish GPS monuments in conjunction with the project's survey.

The topographic limits for the survey shall be as shown on the attached survey limit map.

The topographic survey shall include, but not limited to; edges of pavement, existing centerlines, shoulder breaks, curbing, building corners, driveways, trees, fences, manholes, valves, poles, guiderail, roadside drainage, property pins.

The **Sponsor** shall obtain all available utility or record drawings within the survey limits. Only visible utilities shall be located by the Consultant and inverts on accessible sewer structures shall be measured. Underground utility information shall be requested from the municipality, utility companies and local agencies (but they only provide information within the right of way limits of the road and will not cover services outside of the right of way). The underground utility information provided by utility owners (if available) shall be shown on the mapping. No excavation or other methods of locating underground utilities are included.

For estimating purposes, it is assumed that there will be no snow and ice cover on the project site and that cross-sections of the creek will be taken when the water level is relatively low. Survey limits are attached.

Mapping shall include the following information:

- Datum
- Control points vertical and horizontal control points and benchmarks
- Control tie recovery sketches for control points
- Existing conditions such as bridge features, headwalls/wingwalls/slabs, highway
 pavement edges, shoulders, ditches, driveways, utility poles, signage, striping,
 etc., will be located and mapped.
- Surveyors shall capture elevations and grade breaks at a 50-foot interval to depict
 the site's natural drainage characteristics and produce mapping contours at a 1foot interval.

The deliverable shall consist of data point mapping file in the form of a CSV file and Control tie recovery sketches for control points.

ROW Survey:

- The ROW of Clark Road and adjoining property lines will be determined to Survey quality.
- Three (3) Temporary easements are expected.

Hydraulic Sections:

Hydraulic cross sections will be collected for the hydraulic analysis of the Wyncoop Creek according to Chapter 13 of the NYSDOT Land Surveying Section Standards and Procedures

Manual. More specifically, sections will be taken at both the upstream and downstream faces of the existing bridge, including elevations of the low chord, top of road, and faces of abutments.

- Sections will be taken downstream from the proposed bridge location at 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 1000 and 2000 feet intervals.
- Sections will be taken upstream from the proposed bridge location at 50, 150, 250 and 550 feet intervals.

c) Traffic Data – Not Applicable

d) Subsurface Investigation

The **Consultant** will hire a sub-consultant to perform 2 borings at the project site. The **Consultant** will have a competent person present during drilling operations.

In addition, **The Consultant** will determine the boring locations, diameters, and sampling intervals; designate soil boring numbers; stake out the locations; take the soil borings; document the resulting subsurface information; and survey and map the actual boring locations.

e) Bridge Hydraulics

The **Consultant** will perform a hydraulic analysis in accordance with the principles outlined in the Section 3.4 of the NYSDOT Bridge Manual¹.

The **Sponsor** will approve the selected project design criteria.

The **Consultant** will identify and make rudimentary two (2) evaluations of potential design alternative concepts that would meet the County's defined project objective. The two alternatives will not be developed or detailed. The **Consultant** will discuss conceptual recommendations with the County to select the preferred alternative.

The **Consultant** will prepare and submit an electronic copy of the ADP's to the **Sponsor** for review.

Upon review of the ADP set, the **Sponsor** will provide the **Consultant** with final comments. The **Consultant** will address final comments and resubmit the final set to the **Sponsor**.

The **Consultant** will coordinate with affected utility companies to ensure the timely relocation of utility poles and appurtenances. The **Consultant** will assist the **Sponsor** in preparing any necessary agreements with utility companies.

7. Estimate

The **Consultant** will develop, provide, and maintain the construction cost estimate for the proposed solution.


